

The Antonio Meucci Young Inventors' Competition Sponsored by the Garibaldi-Meucci Museum NYS Grand Lodge Foundation Inc. and Sons of Italy Foundation Con Edison and Richmond County Savings Federation

Throughout his lifetime Antonio Meucci was responsible for many inventions, improvements and ideas. These innovations included smokeless candles, a tea and coffee filtering system, oil/kerosene lamps, and most notably, the telephone.

In keeping with the legacy of inventor Antonio Meucci (1808-1889), the Garibaldi-Meucci Museum is pleased to announce the 2020 Young Inventors' Competition which will be held on Sunday, April 26 at Staten Island Technical High School which is located at 485 Clawson Avenue Staten Island, New York 10306.

The Young Inventors' Competition is open to all students in grades 3 through 8 who attend either public or private school in New York City. The contest invites students to present an original idea for a new invention or an improvement upon an existing one. The invention can be anything from a kitchen gadget to a machine.

Cash prizes will be awarded to individuals or groups for the best inventions.

- 3 first place winners will receive a cash prize of \$200
- 3 second place winners will receive a cash prize of \$100
- 3 third place winners will receive a cash prize of \$75
- 3 fourth place winners will receive a cash prize of \$50

The judges will be looking for:

- Simple, creative solutions to common problems
- An understanding of the **scientific principles** behind the invention. **Scientific principles** can refer to any scientific theory. For example, the theory of evolution or theory of relativity.

PLEASE NOTE: There is no fee to enter the competition!

The deadline for entries is Friday, March 13, 2020

Inventions may come from an individual or a group of same-grade students.

The contestants' completed applications will first be judged by museum staff members. The finalists chosen will be invited to present their entries to a panel of expert judges on Sunday, April 26, 2020 at Staten Island Technical High School.

Rules:

- 1. Only one completed application per student or group will be accepted. Applications will not be returned.
- 2. The idea for an invention must be an original idea that comes from the student.
- 3. The idea must be unique. It can be a brand-new product or a way to improve upon an existing product.
- 4. Photos and diagrams are optional but highly recommended.
- 5. Prototypes are highly recommended.
- 6. Do not send completed projects with the application.
- 7. Finalists will be notified and asked to create and present their invention for the judges on the date of the final competition.
- 8. All NYC students, in public or private school, grades 3-8 are eligible to participate.
- 9. Students must present their idea in a clear and creative manner.
- 10. Maximum number of students per group is 4. All students must be in the same grade.
- 11. Each group entry must have a group representative. The awarded prize will be presented to the group representative who will distribute the prize equally to the group members.
- 12. All applications must be received by Friday, March 13, 2020.
- 13. Semi-finalists will be notified by telephone and email.
- 14. Incomplete applications will be disqualified.

- 9-Did you have any help with this project? If yes, please describe the help you received.
- 10-What are the scientific principles used in your invention?
- 11- Add any additional information you think the judges should know.
- 12-What resources have you used to research/create your invention? (i.e. library, internet, videos)
